Application Details for Each Bursary/Scholarship:

1. Aaron Sluggett Memorial Scholarship

Bowen students who have demonstrated their willingness to provide leadership, service to others and/or involvement in sports and are graduating from Grade 12 in 2014 are eligible to apply for this \$500 Scholarship.

Please use the following application details as a Checklist:

An applicant must provide all of the following information, by April 11th, 2014:

- ◆ Her/his full name, address, telephone number and email address.
- ◆ A letter demonstrating his/her:
 - Role as a leader in school or the community and/or strong work ethic
 - Service to others and/or involvement in sports
 - Personal connection to Bowen and the Bowen community
 - Career goal & academic performance
 - Why the scholarship would make a difference
- ◆ Proof of acceptance at a recognized Canadian post-secondary institution, including the applicant's student number and the address of the institution.
- ◆ A letter of reference from someone other than a relative. Appropriate contact information for the reference must be included, and the Selection Committee may contact the reference.
- ◆ A copy of the applicant's transcript of scholastic standing from the most recent year of attendance at a recognized educational institution (either secondary or post-secondary). The successful candidates may be asked to provide an official transcript.

2. Bowen Island Golf Association Junior Scholarship

A total of \$1,000 will be awarded to Bowen students who have been a full play junior or intermediate member of the Bowen Island Golf Club for at least two (2) years. Scholarships will be awarded to students proceeding from grade 12 to any academic, vocational, or technical institution in Canada. Post secondary students may also apply. Candidates must have an overall C or better grade average in semester immediately preceding the deadline.

The following information, in full, must accompany the application:

- ☞ Her/his full name, address, telephone number and email address.
- ☞ A statement of the actual years the applicant has been a full play junior or intermediate member of the Bowen Island Golf Club: 20___, 20___, etc.
- ☞ A letter from a member in the community written on behalf of the applicant, with regard to your leadership qualities, community activities and character.
- ☞ A copy of your current year 1st and 2nd semester marks.

Note that:

1. Confirmation of the scholarship will be by way of a letter from the BIGC Scholarship Committee presented at the successful applicant's graduation ceremony. The scholarship will be funded upon the successful applicant confirming their accepted registration in a post secondary academic institution or trade school.
2. Scholarships may be claimed up to two (2) years after graduation, or in special circumstances, where letter request is made to and approved by the BIGC Scholarship Committee up to three (3) years after graduation.
3. The selection of scholarship winners is solely the responsibility of the BIGC Scholarship Committee. All applications shall remain the property of the Committee.

3. Knick Knack Nook Bursaries for Environmental Sustainability

The purpose of Knick Knack Nook Re-Use It Store Society is to foster environmental responsibility through both action and education. To that end, a total of \$10,000 will be awarded in 2014 to students with ties to Bowen and who are pursuing careers in support of environmental sustainability through studies at the undergraduate or post-graduate level (or equivalent).

Students may receive this Bursary no more than twice. Incomplete, late, or applications submitted other than electronic format will not be considered.

Please use the following application details as a Checklist:

An applicant must provide all of the following information, by May 30th, 2014:

- ◆ Her/his full name, address, telephone number and email address.
- ◆ A letter outlining:
 - The course of studies being pursued;
 - How the applicant's course of studies will help her/him foster environmental sustainability;
 - The applicant's connection to Bowen and the Bowen community;
 - Volunteer or other work that relates to community life and environmental sustainability;
 - Her/his financial need and how the Award would make a difference.
- ◆ Proof of acceptance at a recognized Canadian post-secondary institution, including the applicant's student number and the address of the institution.
- ◆ A letter of reference from someone other than a relative. Appropriate contact information for the reference must be included, and the Selection Committee may contact the reference.
- ◆ A copy of the applicant's transcript of scholastic standing from the most recent year of attendance at a recognized educational institution (either secondary or post-secondary). The successful candidates may be asked to provide an official transcript.
