


Dear Bowen Island Neighbour,

The Bowen Island Community Foundation is grateful for any donation it receives to help fulfil our mission of engaging the community and inspiring generosity that will benefit Bowen Island for generations through an enriched quality of life for all Bowen Islanders. Bowen is one of 60 BC communities to have a community foundation and there are more than 200 across Canada, supported by our umbrella organization, Community Foundations of Canada. Wherever they are, how they work is more or less the same—raising funds locally through donations from the community, and carefully and responsibly stewarding them so that grants, scholarships, and bursaries can be returned to the community wherever they are needed. By pooling donations and investing them, donations work together, in perpetuity, for the benefit of the community. Our tagline is “Community Grows Here” and through the generosity of Bowen over the past 23 years, we have grown a very nice garden! We can always do more though, and to inspire you (as it did us) let me tell you something about what BICF was able to do over the past year thanks to Bowen’s generosity:

- \$75,000 was granted in Community Impact Grants to Bowen organizations to enable them to enrich community life on Bowen: Snug Cove House will enhance accessibility in its new building; the Hearth was able to present the Authentically Indigenous Festival; Bowen youth continued to present their Queen vs. Green spring festival; Bowen Golf will make golf more accessible for youth; BIRCH (Bowen Island Resilient Community Housing) will develop its plan for building accessible housing; Bowen Island Community School will provide support to increase playground accessibility for non-verbal, neurodiverse, and blind community members; Seniors Keeping Young (SKY) will continue to expand its programs.
- Ten Neighbourhood Small Grants (NSG) brought people together for projects ranging from a pruning workshop to planting a pollinator garden and a neighbourhood beach party. A special Spring Clean-up NSG program funded neighbours’ cooperative efforts to remove storm debris.
- The BICF and Knick Knack Nook Scholarships Program provided 43 scholarships and bursaries, totalling \$81,000, to students pursuing training or post-secondary education in diverse fields including health sciences, environmental studies, and music.
- Donations provided a number of young people in need with access to counselling through our Youth at Risk Fund and 11 individuals and their families received short-term assistance from our Helping Hand Fund as they faced unexpected hardships.

*Please consider making a donation that will keep having a positive impact like these on our community and so that we can do even more.* A gift to the Community Impact Fund provides the most flexibility, enabling the Community Foundation to respond to community needs as priorities emerge through grants to community organizations and individuals in need.
