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	Applicants were well-prepared and enthusiastic and the committee was impressed that they made the effort to prepare written responses to the set of questions. The interview process works, and works well, in terms of building relationships. They believe that, due to the combination of good luck and good planning, everything has fallen into place and they arrived at the right mix of grant allocations. In short, the process and our recommendations are well-documented. Significantly, we have observed a progressive strengthening of the granting process as, each year, applicants have been rising to the occasion to meet the Foundation's expectations.
